Children's Emigration Homes (Middlemore): Indexing Project and Acknowledgements

Between 2001 and 2017, more than 60 friends and members of the British Isles Family History Society of Greater Ottawa (BIFHSGO) volunteered untold hours of their time and energy to extract information from the microfilmed Middlemore archives held by Library and Archives Canada. Some also helped check and file the collected materials, or critique and edit my written explanations. Their contributions have been outstanding.

Using the information so produced, I created two indexes—the Middlemore CEH Nominal Index (updated in 2021) and the Contents of the CEH (Middlemore) Annual Reports (1872/3–1939) —and each of the accompanying explanatory Guide or Notes. These items are now available for the use of anyone researching the children brought between 1873 and 1932 from Britain and settled in Canada by J. T. Middlemore's Children's Emigration Homes, Birmingham, England.

I would particularly like to acknowledge the late Ann Adams, Marion Crawford, Bert Hayward, Caroline Herbert, Christine Jackson, Marc Pichette and Brenda Turner for their unfailing encouragement and continued support over the years. Their contributions during these many years are much appreciated. I also want to thank John McConkey for his work in posting the Middlemore Nominal Index on the BIFHSGO website in 2019, especially for making the large and complicated Index searchable, the first one to be so organized on the BIFHSGO website. Users are now able to obtain copies of referenced documents of Middlemore children of interest and background CEH information affecting them from Library and Archives Canada, the Library of Birmingham, and the National Archives of Australia.
